Sauvion du Cleray, Vallet, Loire, France
If only all Muscadet tasted this good! Bone dry, but packed with delicious citrus fruit flavours.
15. **CHABLIS Saint Martin, 2005** 24.95
Domaine Laroche, Chablis, Burgundy, France
Fine gold colour with full fruit on the nose and in palate and with the authentic stoney Chablis character.
16. **SANCERRE, 2005** 29.95
Domaine Vacheron, Loire, France
Highly-praised Sancerre producer living up to the Domaine reputation with an excellent example of Loire Sauvignon Blanc.
18. **POUILLY FUMÉ, Villa Paulus, 2005** 27.00
Domaine Masson Blondelet, Loire, France
With terrific balance and depth, and the elegance and the smoky richness that only Pouilly Fumé, of all the Sauvignon Blancs, can achieve.
19. **CHÂTEAU HAUT RIAN, 2006** 16.50
Rions, Bordeaux Sec, France
A supremely fresh smooth dry white, with a rich silky fruitiness, from Semillon and Sauvignon Grapes.
20. **CHENIN BLANC, 2007** 13.95
Klippenkop, Western Cape, South Africa
Light and fragrant, with an ultra fresh pear quality, perfect with lighter fish and chicken dishes.
21. **DART VALLEY 'RESERVE', 2006** 16.50
Sharpham Vineyard, Totnes, Devon, England
A full flavoured, zippy white, grown only a few miles from here! Very energetic and exuberant with masses of dry, crunchy fruit to the fore.
22. **SAUVIGNON BLANC, 2006** 15.50
Montes, Curico, Chile
Crammed with fresh gooseberry fruit flavours – classic New World Sauvignon
23. **PINOT GRIGIO, 2006** 18.95
St Michael Eppan, Alto Adige, Sud-Tirol, Italy
The best cool climate region for this delicate, aromatic grape! Rich and fruity aromas lead to a dry and soft palate with hints of ripe, warm pears.
24. **MAYVAL, Medium Dry 2005** 16.95
Manstree Estate, Exeter, Devon
From their beautiful estate just outside Exeter in Shillingford St George, the Boyce family grow fantastic Madeline Angevine and Seyval Blanc grapes which are blended together in this off dry, fruity fresh elegant wine which shows just how far English wine has evolved in the last 10 years.

25. **CLOUDY BAY SAUVIGNON BLANC, 2006** **34.00**
Cloudy Bay, Marlborough, New Zealand
The ultimate New World Sauvignon from one of the most famous wineries in the world. Concentrated and aromatic with classic elderflower and gooseberry fruit, and a complex tropical fruit quality.
26. **SAUVIGNON BLANC, 2005** **19.95**
Esk Valley, Hawkes Bay, New Zealand
For classic, concentrated Kiwi Sauvignon, look no further. Explosive tropical fruit aromas, mouth-watering freshness and irresistible citrus flavours.
27. **CONDRIEU, 2001** **49.95**
E. Guigal, Rhone, France
Three great words: *Condrieu*, the place, *Vioignier*, the grape, *Guigal*, the producer. Here is an elegantly matured classic to match its reputation.
28. **GEWURZTRAMINER, 2005** **16.95**
Paul Cluver Estate, Elgin, South Africa
Quite the best Gewurztraminer we have tasted outside Alsace, dry and fresh, with incredible depth of rose petal and lychee fruit.
29. **VIOGNIER, 2005** **15.50**
Michel Laroche (South of France), Vin de Pays d'Oc, France
The assertive Viognier aroma leaps forward with vivid flower scents. The Palate is dashing yet full, with notes of citrus, peach & pepper.
30. **PINOT BLANC, 2004** **17.95**
Domaine Henry Fuchs, Ribeauvillé, Alsace, France
From a virtually organic winery, which dramatically reduces its yields to produce outstandingly concentrated, rich and weighty wines. Off, to medium dry with a very long, honeyed finish.
31. **RIESLING, 2006** **19.95**
Hermann Donnhoff, Nahe, Germany
Fuller bodied than the fine Rieslings of the Mosel, the best wines of the Nahe region are piercingly aromatic with fine lime fresh nose, a white peach fruitiness, a unique minerality and outstanding balance.
One of the best Estates in Germany, let alone the Nahe, the Donnhoffs have been making wine since the 1750's, and Helmut Donnhoff, the present winemaker has been awarded Gault Millau's winemaker of the year, credited with playing a crucial part in reestablishing the reputation of German Riesling.

Richer, Weighty, and Oaked Whites

We have marked the wines (O) which have a perceptible oak influence.

32. **RIOJA BLANCO, Monople, 2005 (O)** 19.95
C.V.N.E, Haro. Rioja Alta, Spain
This could only be White Rioja, with its intense, crisp citrusy fruit, which is barrel fermented, giving a pervasive oakiness, and a lovely long creamy finish. Superb!
33. **MARSANNE, Thomas Mitchell, 2004** 15.50
Mitchelton Winery, New South Wales, Australia
Extraordinary value! Fresh yet powerful aromatic dry white with a characteristic hint of honeysuckle on the nose, citrus marmalade on the palate and a touch of honey on the finish.
34. **CHABLIS 1ER CRU, Mont de Milieu, 2005** 34.00
Domaine Pinson, Chablis, Burgundy, France
Established in the early 17th Century, this 10 hectare estate is one of the most 'senior' estates in Chablis, both in terms of its reputation and the sheer quality of its wines. The 2005 Mont de Milieu is a full-bodied 1er Cru, rich with honeyed fruit and tremendous concentration of flavour. A great Chablis from a great vintage.
35. **MACON BLANC DAVAYÉ, 2005/06** 18.50
Domaine des Maillettes, Maconnais, Burgundy, France
A luscious "mineral" Chardonnay, with masses of generous but very pure fruit, and a sensational rich finish.
36. **PULIGNY MONTRACHET, les Charmes, 2003** 42.00
Domaine Jean-Louis Chavy, Burgundy, France
From one of the finest estates in Puligny, comes this almost perfect expression of White Burgundy, from a superb vintage. Tremendous purity of fruit, and a concentrated, rich creamy finish.
37. **CHARDONNAY, 2006 (O)** 14.95
Castle Creek, South Eastern Australia
A modern Chardonnay, slightly oaked which allows the fruit to shine through on the palate. From a relatively cool region of Australia helping to bring a higher degree of finesse and balance to the finish.
38. **POUILLY FUISSÉ, 2005** 27.95
Domaine Mathias, Chaintré, Burgundy, France
Wonderfully concentrated and ripe, with delicate nutty flavours, and overtones of acacia. The maturity of the vine ensures a degree of complexity seldom seen in this appellation.
39. **CHARDONNAY, 2004** 22.95
Nautilus Estate, Marlborough, New Zealand
A superb example of what New Zealand is capable of – very classy, almost Burgundian Chardonnay, with rich pineapple scented fruit, and a warm brioche finish.
40. **PINOT GRIS, 2002** 20.95
Firesteed Estate, Oregon, USA
Showing great varietal characteristics of ripe pear, this superbly concentrated wine also hints at Crème Brûlée and cinnamon, with a fleshy richness underpinned by a brilliant mineral edge. Off dry, and delightful with full flavoured dishes.

Light Fruity Reds

Great without food, or with salads, light meat and many fish dishes.

- 41. BEAUJOLAIS VILLAGES, 2005** **17.95**
Chateau de Grandmont, Beaujolais, France
Jean-Charles Pivot is a master winemaker and this wonderfully fresh and fruity wine is undoubtedly of 'Cru' quality. This is crammed to the brim with soft, juicy and very succulent raspberry and red cherry flavours.
- 42. FLEURIE, Clos de la Chapelle des Bois, 2005** **23.95**
Domaine Fernand Verpoix, Beaujolais, France
Fleurie is known as the 'Queen' of Beaujolais because of its elegance and finesse. Produced from 100% old vine Gamay, this is fresh, light and 'ultra-juicy'
- 43. TARRANGO, 2005** **14.95**
Brown Brothers, Milawa, Victoria, Australia
Tarrango is a specially developed grape variety producing a very light yet full flavoured cherry scented red, which drinks perfectly on its own or with lighter meat and fish dishes.
- 44. SANCERRE ROUGE, Les Cailleries 2004** **29.50**
Domaine Vacheron, Loire, France
One of the view domaines that produce excellent red Sancerre as well as white. Great red-purple colour with a very appealing nose stuffed with Pinot Noir character - slightly roasted black cherry fruit, with a streak of fine, dark chocolate. Silky texture and a persistent satin finish. Lightish and very elegant.

Classic, Elegant, Fruit-Driven Reds

Classic wines to accompany food, these are stylish and elegant, perfect with all meat dishes, and for those who prefer a less fleshy style of wine

- 45. MERCUREY, les Ormeaux, 2004** **28.50**
Domaine Jean Marechal, Mercurey, Burgundy, France
This small family owned winery specialises in deeply coloured, intense wines, and their 'single vineyard' Mercurey has sweet black cherry fruit on the nose, and complex layers of black fruit and a hint of oak, on the palate.
- 46. GEVREY CHAMBERTIN, 2004** **42.50**
Domaine Dupont-Tisserandot, Cote de Nuits, Burgundy, France
An exciting find, this Domaine only ships a tiny amount to the UK, mostly selling to some of the best Parisian restaurants. Their reds are simply superb - ripe, concentrated, handcrafted wines, with silky black cherry fruitiness and superbly integrated oak. The 2003 is typical of the superb vintage, open and forward.
- 47. CHÂTEAU DES JOUALLES, 2003** **16.95**
Bordeaux Superieur, France
From the same team that made the excellent Château Lassegue, St Emilion. This is deeply coloured, ripe, fruit-driven Claret, with excellent structure.
60% Merlot, 20% Cabernet Sauvignon and 20% Cabernet Franc.
- 48. RIOJA RESERVA, 2002** **22.95**
C.V.N.E. Rioja Alta, Rioja, Spain
From one of the most quality conscious wineries in Rioja, the Reserva is aged for over three years (two in oak casks), before being released. Full of rich, ripe oaky fruit, with a superb, long vanilla finish.
- 49. PINOT NOIR, 2005** **31.50**
Nautilus, Marlborough, New Zealand
The Best Pinot Noir we have tasted outside Burgundy (and from there, a wine of this quality would cost twice the price!) The Pinot Noir 2005 is dark ruby in colour with a lifted aroma of plums and black cherry against a background of spicy oak. The palate is medium bodied with a fleshy middle and fine tannins at the finish. A silver medal winner at the 2006 International Wine Challenge. Not to be missed.

Rich, Rounded Smooth Reds

Listed in order of weight (lighter first) these wines are mostly fuller bodied with fantastic concentration of fleshy ripe fruit.

| 57. MERLOT, 2005/06 | 15.50 |
| Vina Carmen, Rapel Valley, Chile | |
| Rich, deep and plummy, with hints of chocolate on the nose. It is easy to see why Chile has become a spiritual home for Merlot. | |
| 58. COTES DU RHONE VILLAGES, 'Visan', 2005 | 18.95 |
| Domaine Roche-Audran, Buisson, Rhone Valley, France | |
| A deep-coloured meaty red with excellent purity of fruit and a fleshiness combined with a suppleness that is so rarely achieved. A wonderful finish and complexity. This is very talented wine-making indeed. | |

59. **MASSAYA 'Cuvee Classic' Red, 2005** 19.95
Brunier, Ghosn & Hebrard, Bekaa Valley, Lebanon
One of our most exciting discoveries, a collaboration between one of the best producers of Chateauneuf du Pape (Daniel Brunier of Vieux Telegraph), Dominique Hebrard of St Emilion (Chateau Trianon) and the Lebanese Proprietors, Sami and Ramzi Ghosn, a blend of Cinsault and Cabernet Sauvignon, smooth, supple and very spicy. Quite amazing!
60. **CARMENERE, 2006** 15.95
Cornellana Estate, Rapel, Chile
The 'forgotten' grape of Bordeaux, Carmenere is now experiencing a renaissance in Chile where its character can be compared to 'turbo-charged' Merlot! Deeply coloured with complex flavours of spicy plums, cherries and just a hint of chocolate .
62. **PINOTAGE, Beyerskloof, 2006** 14.95
Beyers Treuter, Stellenbosch, South Africa
From the "King of Pinotage", rich, well structured, and one of the best - deep raspberry fruit, with good backbone and the whiff of wood smoke and tar.
63. **CHÂTEAU LA TOUR DE BY, 2002** 27.95
Cru Grand Bourgeois, Medoc, Bordeaux, France
Widely regarded as the most consistent of all the Cru Bourgeois wines due to a ferociously rigorous selection of grapes in the winery. Deeply coloured, full bodied and concentrated with a rich blackberry character and ripe supple tannins.
64. **SHIRAZ, ' Bin 2000', 2005** 17.00
McGuigan Wines, South Australia
Deep and vibrant, with a blackberry spiciness, hint of eucalyptus, and fine grained tannins. Everything we look for from this popular grape.
65. **BAROLO, 2003** 33.95
Azienda Agricola Patrizi, Farigliano, Piedmont, Italy
In the rolling Piedmontese hills, Nebbiolo produces full-flavoured, gamey, tannic wines with lovely acidity, making them a wonderful match for full flavoured meat dishes. Patrizi specialise in earlier drinking Barolos, not allowing the fruit to dry out.
66. **CHÂTEAU LASSEGUE, 1998** 37.50
Grand Cru, St. Emilion, Bordeaux, France
A superb vintage of this Merlot based Claret, made from 30 year old vines. The concentrated damson and cassis body is balanced by well integrated tannins.
67. **CHATEAU LANGOA BARTON, 1996** 65.00
3eme Cru Classé, St Julien, Bordeaux, France
One of the very best of the St Juliens, Langoa-Barton is still fermented in wood resulting in a softer, more elegant style. The dominant Cabernet offers spicy blackcurrant and cedar but it is restrained enough to allow the Merlot's rounded fruitiness to influence.

- 68. CHATEAU PICHON LONGUEVILLE COMTESSE DE LANDE, 1988 140.00**
2eme Cru Classé, Pauillac, Bordeaux, France
A world famous wine whose finesse and elegance are legendary. The stunning 1988 presents a wine which has a beautiful texture and colour, a glorious aroma, and a memorable finish. Something very special.
- 69. VACQUEYRAS, Cuvee Azalais, 2003 32.00**
Domaine le Sang des Caillieux, Rhone Valley, France
Winemaker Serge Férigoule makes fantastic hand-crafted Vacqueyras from his 16 hectares of vineyards in the Rhone valley. The 2003 'Cuvee Azalais' is a fine example – delicious soft, ripe, & supple fruit with a charred smokiness and silky soft tannins. A wine with excellent balance and a long, long finish.
- 70. RIDGE ZINFANDEL, Lytton Springs, 2005 45.00**
Ridge Vineyards, Cupertino, Santa Cruz Mountains, California, USA
Paul Draper has been the wine maker at ridge since 1969 and is one of the main revivalists of the Zinfandel grape in California. This is a big, opulent, and decadent wine with a voluptuous texture and a focused, fleshy, black cherry & spicy fruit finish. A real classic from a great vineyard & wine maker.
- 71. CHATEAUNEUF DU PAPE, 2004 35.50**
Domaine de la Roquette, Rhone, France
Surpassing its more famous sister Vieux Telegraphe in recent press tastings (both estates are run by the Brunier brothers) Very rich, with an intense blackberry and liquorice fruitiness, unfiltered to retain the true character of the region. A "benchmark" wine of genuine world class.
- 72. COTE ROTIE 'Brune et Blonde', 2001 55.00**
E. Guigal, Rhone, France
The peak of the classic northern Rhones from the canonised E. Guigal. Exciting, evolved, rich, & textured like satin.

Old Station, California
On the sweeter side of medium, with aromatic strawberry fruit and a concentrated summer fruit palate. Very easy drinking.

A juicy blend of Merlot & Cabernet Franc, showing bright redcurrant aromas and superb freshness & brightness. A wine to take seriously whatever the season.
